Action Plan for European Standardisation

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Introduction to the context

In its Communication on “the role of European standardisation in the framework of European policies and legislation” of 18 October 2004¹, the Commission highlighted its standardisation policy and formulated recommendations aiming to improve the European standardisation system.

In its “Conclusions on European standardisation” of 21-22 December 2004², a reaction to the above mentioned Commission Communication, the Council invited the Commission to elaborate as a matter of priority, in co-operation with Member States and parties concerned, in particular the European standardisation organisations (ESOs)³, an action plan aiming at further implementing the recommendations of the Commission’s Communication.

In this regard, the “action plan for European standardisation” has been developed by the Commission in conjunction with European Free Trade Association (EFTA), the ESOs and National Standards Bodies (NSBs), the Member States and stakeholders. The action plan reflects in operational terms the Commission’s Communication and the Council Conclusions and must be considered in liaison with these two documents. It outlines the most important actions to be performed and identifies the key players for every action, it is not exhaustive, however. During its implementation, it is probable that more Commission services than those listed as key players in the document will be involved. The action plan also defines a timeframe for carrying out the actions.

The action plan is publicly available and serves as a tool to provide transparency and further promote European standardisation. The implementation of some actions implies budgetary resources. However, it is not in the scope of the action plan to tackle budgetary issues.

The action plan stretches over a time period of approximately four years, commencing in October 2005 and terminating in December 2009. However, the full implementation of some of the actions included is not possible within this timeframe and will therefore extend beyond this period. It is a rolling plan that is monitored and updated regularly. The Commission, together with the above interested parties, regularly reviews the planned actions and the actions already carried out in order to follow-up their implementation and to define further work.

This latest updated version of the action plan reflects the Commission's newest initiatives that will impact on standardisation, especially the Lead Market Initiative for Europe⁴ (LMI) and the Commission Communication "Towards an increased contribution from standardisation to innovation in Europe"⁵.

The LMI aims to unlock the market potential for innovative goods and services in the following six key areas: eHealth, protective textiles, sustainable construction, bio-based products, recycling and renewable energies. The overall approach is demand-driven, involving broad market segments of strategic societal and economic interest. Major policy instruments to be used to promote the LMI include also standardisation. The Commission Communication "Towards an increased contribution from standardisation to innovation in Europe" places in focus a greater contribution from standardisation to innovation and competitiveness.
